## Advanced Placement Examinations

In 2019, 190 Webb students took a total of 503 AP Exams. Eighty-eight percent of those students achieved a score of 3 or higher, which included 76 scores of 5 and 153 scores of 4 .

## Forward Thinking

After completing the Upper School's Research Methods course, Webb juniors can continue their independent research in the Research Fellows program. Projects have included promoter screening in poplar protoplasts, the optimization of a protocol to measure amyloidosis, and the screening of children for a genetic mutation in the leptin receptor gene.

Empowering students to formulate their own ideas while exploring their passions is also the force
behind Webb MD, a student-created program that puts Upper Schoolers in direct contact with mentors and experts in the healthcare field.

## Innovator, Communicator

Webb alumnus Omar Baldonado is Director of Software Engineering, Infra Network at
Facebook where he leads a team that builds the global network for Facebook, Messenger, Instagram, WhatsApp, Oculus, and others.

## A Standard of Success

In 2018-2019, Webb brought home six state team titles, including the Lady Spartans' sixth straight state volleyball crown, a seven-peat for girls' cross-country, a 10-peat and a three-peat for girls' and boys' tennis, respectively, and first-ever team championships for boys' basketball and girls' track \& field.

## Media Industry Leader

Webb alumna Allison Page is President of Discovery Inc.'s joint venture with Magnolia, the home and lifestyle brand led by Chip and Joanna Gaines. In this role, Page oversees all programming, development and operations for the multiplatform media company. Previously, Page was President of HGTV and Food Network.

## Thinking Globally

Through Webb's Interact Club, Spartan servantleaders have traveled to South Africa, Hungary and India for service projects. Webb high school students also venture abroad to create their own global/ educational experiences, including a survey of English literature in the UK; biological research in Honduras; historical study of D-Day in Normandy and London; language learning trips to France, China and Spain; and service projects in the Dominican Republic.
