Non-Credit Course Offerings for Webb Upper School Students

ENGLISH

■ College Application Essay Writing

A two-week course in which students will learn strategies for writing a variety of college application essays and have opportunities to workshop and receive substantive feedback on their own essays. (*Maximum of 8 students per session.*)

■ Ramp Up to High School English

Nervous about high school English? This mini-course will work to build students' abilities and confidence in English at any level. Together, we'll tackle creative and argumentative writing to accompany our reading of Lemony Snicket's *A Series of Unfortunate Events: The Bad Beginning.* We'll build our understanding of the novel with excerpts from myths, nonfiction pieces, and film, in addition to developing students' ability to annotate and read critically. All students will develop their skills as readers and writers, with activities customized to students' needs and interests.

(Maximum of 10 students; additional sessions may be added if needed.)

■ Sci-Fi & Fantasy 101

Ridley Scott fiend? Or more a fan of the Shire? This course will dive into some of the hallmarks of genre fiction, while also exploring some lesser-known works. We'll survey fiction and film, and look at some of the origins of genre writing. In addition, students will develop pieces of their own.

■ Exploring Mythology 101

Could Thor beat Hercules in an arm-wrestling match? In this course, we'll debate this and more, as we explore mythologies from around the world. We'll look at the stories behind the names and explore how those stories have been told across different forms of art. In addition, we'll try writing mythological stories of our own.

SOCIAL STUDIES

■ Writing for AP Social Studies

Students will be introduced to the standard test components of all AP social studies exams: the Short Answer Question, the Long Essay Question, and the Document Based Question. They will review the rubrics for each type of writing on the exam, as well as practice writing over the course of the week. Because the exam format is identical across World History, U.S. History, and European History, this course would benefit any student who would like to get a head start with some writing skills before the school year begins. The course will draw on students' knowledge of World History (from their ninth grade course) as well as U.S. History (from their eighth grade course).

MATHEMATICS

■ Ramp Up to Algebra I

This mini-course is designed to support incoming freshmen in the transition from eighth grade math to Algebra I.

■ Ramp Up to Algebra II

This course is designed to support students moving from Geometry to Algebra II. Students further develop their skills in Algebra I and problem-solving techniques necessary for successful advanced study.

■ Ramp Up to Geometry

This mini-course is designed to support incoming freshmen and rising sophomores who have completed Algebra I and will be taking Geometry.

ACT PREP CLASSES

Webb School is now offering ACT Prep classes to help students prepare during the summer for this important test as they move into the college admissions process. We think it is a major benefit for Webb students to be tutored by Webb teachers who have a personal knowledge of the students, their needs, and their learning styles.

ACT Prep classes will be offered for English, reading, science, and math.
